Doug Rokke has served the US Army and US Army Reserves with honor and distinction. He is a Vietnam and Gulf War combat veteran; a health physicist assigned to the U.S. Army Depleted Uranium Assessment team in the Gulf War; and U.S. Army Depleted Uranium Project director from 1994 – 1995, with a Ph.D. from the University of Illinois, 1992.

Rokke directed the development, instruction, and assessment of radiation safety education and field procedures for the U.S. Army at the Bradley Radiological Laboratories, Fort McClellan, AL from 1996-97.

159,000 Gulf War vets were on disability for service related injury and illness as of May, 2002. Over 20,000 claims await the V.A. The V.A. has authorized disability benefits for 1 in 4 Gulf War vets.
